- Rev'd Up Rides Car Show:
 - Budget
 - Portapotties \$350 - Anytime Outhouses
 - All other companies wanted to charge delivery fee

 - Dashplaques
 - 25 Dashplaques - Deco Indy can make. Just need sizes so we can get a quote. Budgeting \$150.

 - Event T shirt for SEC staff. Budgeting \$100.
 - Deco Indy quoting \$19.95 each with pocket design on front and big back graphic
 - \$22.75 for 2X, etc
 - Kala Morris says she will cover cost of printing if we just cover cost of shirts from Hobby Lobby (Canvas or Hanes)
 - Ashley will send our logo to Kala so she can give better quote

 - Signs
 - Rough estimate is \$200
 - Dudley will talk to Deco Indy about cost. Dudley is going to make a list of what directional signs are needed.

 - Music/Band - Budgeting \$500 but need to save if can
 - Molter Brothers have asked about performing again.
 - \$500 this time (gave us a discount last time at \$300)
 - May want a band to perform from 10-noon and leave remainder time for DJ
 - Kala says Chris Welch is a local musician with a very strong following that puts on a great performance and would probably be significantly cheaper.

- Kala will check with him on quote
- DJ with Equipment - Budgeting \$300
 - Have been speaking with Ryan Henry
 - \$300 quote for DJing
 - Could use him Noon - 3:30pm
 - Want to make sure we have DJ set up in plenty of time for awards at 3pm
- Paper Flyers - Greek's sponsoring
 - As cars check in, give flyers/goodie bag that tells where they can eat
 - Can put dashplaques in the first 25 cars bags
 - Would like to have them on April 1st - Greek's will print for free
- Awards - Budgeting \$50
 - 3D logo awards on big chains made by Laura Gillim
 - She is covering cost as a donation
 - Maurice commissioned a trophy made last year with car parts. He is giving it to us for the show this year. We can use it as the "Best in Show" trophy.
 - It cost him \$100 to have it made. Consider donating money to him if in the budget.
- Application Fee to Town of Sheridan - \$200
- The total budget for the car show is \$1850 - hopefully lower if we find ways to save.
 - Motion to approve the budget for the car show - Dudley
 - Maurice - 2nds
 - Approved by unanimous vote.
- Vendors confirmed:
 - Donuts and coffee
 - Gosia's Rustic Kitchen
 - Greek's Pizzeria (Kala says they will need to open at 10am)
- Greek's/Beer Garden

- They will have a beer garden in their patio area and have their parking lot blocked.
 - They understand that 5th Street must remain open due to new town rules.
 - They have submitted applications already.
 - They have requested that the sound system/band/dj be at end of Main Street in front of Greek's
 - Willing to give a percentage of sales of a specific beer to the Events Committee as a donation, but unsure what percentage yet.
 - Greek's and WKRP will NOT be donating to the events committee this year per Curt Whitesell.
- Capacity/Spots for Car show
 - Max of 140 cars (120 more comfortably)
 - Thinking we need to direct traffic to where they should park
 - Reserve parking spots for preregistered vehicles
- Lot Permissions
 - United Feeds & Christian Church
 - Dudley contacting and getting asap
 - Golf Lot
 - Diana emailed Dan and heard back from him. He says Mike Broshear claims someone reached out already, but we think maybe that was Jeep Invasion or town? Will follow-up with Dan and get permission from Mike asap
- Hours of show:
 - 9-11am registration
 - 11-2pm judging
 - 3pm awardsFinalize map for town application
- Carol is calling the insurance company Wednesday to update the policy's expiration date.
- IDHS permit
 - Diana has applied on the website twice, but it keeps giving an error message and saying that they will email us. No emails have been received.
 - Diana will call them tomorrow to get the permit moving.

- Health Department application
 - Carol will contact them. Diana says the application is on the drive in the town application folder for Rev'd Up Rides 2026, but it still needs vendor information added.
- Emails to Car Clubs
 - Ashley has posted the event on social media and we already have 13 cars registered for the event.
 - Ashley has a list of car clubs to send invites to.
 - Diana says there is a spreadsheet with registration information from last year's participants. Several gave their emails in order to be contacted for future car shows. Ashley will send invites to them as well.
 - Maurice has a contact for a Ben Davis car club and would like to invite them. Ashley will send him the invite to forward.
- Count down
 - May want to do a countdown on social media/website for the available spots
- Accounting
 - Receipts: Give pictures of everything to Diana so they can be uploaded to the drive.
 - New Donations:
 - EMC \$2500
 - Floyd Barker \$500
 - Sheridan Eye Center \$100
 - The Car Show is fully funded.
 - Operations Budget:
 - Post Box \$100 for year
 - Website \$36/month
 - Insurance \$400/year
 - Should budget \$1,000 for the entire year for operating costs.

- Need to decide how much of a percentage of budget goes to fireworks/car show/4th/HM. Decided to divide up funds in account with 50% going to 4th of July, 25% going to Harvest Moon and 25% going into the general fund.
- Wix account money is stuck there until the Secretary of State changes the forms with Carol's name on them. Waiting on documentation. Carol calling tomorrow. Not sure what the delay has been in processing the change from November.
- Diana will give Carol American Water's contact info so she can call them about sponsorship.
- Fundraising:
 - Culver's dine-in night.
 - Minimum of 4 volunteers. Maximum of 6.
 - Must be at least 14 years old.
 - Cleaning trays and dining room. Welcome visitors.
 - Wear similar dress. Closed toed shoes.
 - Small info table if room. Message on digital billboard.
 - 5-8pm. Monday-Wednesday nights.
 - Nancy will look at Grand Park's schedule to pick good dates.
- Contact list from 2025 car show - Diana will make a copy for this year's car show folder.
- 4th of July Planning
 - Meeting at school on Friday at 1pm to discuss 4th of July plans with Sheridan Schools.
 - Carol put together a list of festival activities to go over for 4th of July - on the drive. Lots of good ideas, but will need volunteers to help make them happen.
 - Discussion on pros and cons for changing the 4th of July Festival to a half day event to begin before fireworks in the evening instead of all day as in the past years.
 - It was stated that keeping the festival a full day will keep from upsetting community tradition. One member stated they believe the community will initially be upset, but will adjust.

- It was stated that a full day festival doesn't make sense financially as the dead time in the middle of the day is a huge deterrent to vendors.
 - Venue is being changed this year, more than likely, to the school due to town's insistence that Biddle Park will not be a viable option with construction activities on SR 47 and the intersection in front of the park possibly being under construction.
 - With change in venue, it was felt that this would be a good time to introduce a change in timeframe of the event as well.
 - Some discussion about whether the planning meeting feedback we received was favorable to this change was had
 - The parade by the Lion's Club is usually at 10am. They mentioned the possibility of trying to move the start time to the afternoon at the planning meeting in January, but concerns over the marching band and other group's participation in an evening parade were expressed. Regardless of the start time of the parade, it was stated that the festival time should be moved to after 4pm.
 - One member stated that the evening-only festival will save the committee money.
 - One member believes there is a significant portion of the community who will be left unserved by not providing food after the parade. It was stated that many elderly and veterans do not like fireworks and therefore stay inside in the afternoon to evening hours of the holiday to avoid the loud sounds that can be uncomfortable for those with special needs or ptsd.
 - A significant portion of the community use the 4th of July festival to connect with loved ones who return to town for this event. Concerns over them not wanting evening only activities was expressed.
 - Carol asked everyone to go around the table to vote yes or no to a half day festival. The vote was all in favor minus Diana.
- Ashley spoke with one of the firework companies that have used school property for firework shows in the past. They say we will need to have everyone off the football field by 9 if fireworks are at 10pm. Unsure if the fireworks will be approved yet. Will find out at the meeting with school on Friday.
 - A tractor show would have to be in a different area than the football field.
 - Need to know what we can use and what we can't use at the school.

- Carol said going forward we will plan for a half-day festival to begin in the evening hours.
